

Be more proactive this year, Governor Mimiko charge Ondo workers

Workers in the public service of Ondo State have been charged to be more proactive this year and see themselves as tools to be used by God for the transformation of the State.

The State Governor, Dr Olusegun Mimiko, who stated this during the New Year prayer held at the premises of his office in Akure, said his administration has a lot of programmes for execution this year and the inputs of the workers would be very crucial both at the conception and execution stages.

Governor Mimiko assured the workers of government's determination to promote their welfare at all times, especially their clamour for salaries' increment, saying the State government was waiting for the decision of the National Assembly on the matter.

The State chief executive, who affirmed that the Nation is currently being confronted with various challenges, including attempts from some quarters to destroy the country, appealed to the people of the state to imbibe the fear of God in their role concerning this year's general elections.

He maintained that his administration would continue to work for the people, stressing that his mission in the state was a divine one from God.

He said 'The wish of God for this state is to turn our ashes to beauty. I want to tell you that your calling this year time is divine and I'm sure you are not going to fail God. Whatever we'll do this year, we must be dutiful and diligent'.

In his message, Bishop Felix Adejumo of the Agape Christian Assembly Akure, admonished the workers to be more determined and active in the New Year, saying their efforts would go a long way in achieving the goals and objectives of the present government in the state.

The cleric, who warned against procrastination by the workers in the handling of government's business, noted that the Mimiko administration has laid a solid foundation for the socio-economic transformation of the state.
