

Mimiko Lauded over People-Oriented Projects

The Ondo State governor, Dr Olusegun Mimiko has been commended by the management team of the Tribune titles for his administration's people-oriented programmes and policies.

Reverend Sam Adesua, Managing Director and Editor-in-Chief of Tribune titles who led the team to visit the governor remarked that Dr Mimiko is actually one of the few at the corridors of power practicalising in real terms the legacy of Chief Obafemi Awolowo.
