

Mimiko Mourns Dead Poly Union Leaders, Say Death Painful

Governor Olusegun Mimiko of Ondo State on Wednesday reiterated his administration's determination to make necessary investment in the procurement of modern equipment that would make the Industrial Development Centre in Oba-Ile in Akure, the State capital, a model citadel of empowerment in the country.

The Governor, who gave the assurance during an inspection tour of facilities at the centre in company of the Director General of the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Agency of Nigeria (SMEDAN), Alhaji Muhammad Nadada Umar and the representative of the Minister of State for Commerce and Industry, Alhaji Lateef Salami, expressed hope that the centre would provide quality entrepreneurial training for the people and reduce the rate of youth unemployment in the state.
